Licensure Update:

Florida Orthotic Fitter License

Orthoses: Prefabricated (Custom Fitted)

State Note Update:

FL - Note D

Suppliers who have any patient contact are considered to be "fitting" an orthotic and are required to be licensed. (e.g. Orthotist, Orthotist/Prosthetist, Orthotic Fitter). Suppliers who do not have patient contact, i.e. mail order only, do not require a license.

Tennessee

ABC/BOC Certified Orthotic Fitter

Orthoses: Prefabricated (Custom Fitted)

State Note Update:

TN - Note C

A license to provide custom orthotics or prosthetics is not required of a health care practitioner licensed under Title 63, such as a physician or nurse who is acting within his or her lawful scope of practice. New State Note:

TN - Note G

Tennessee does not issue an orthotic fitter license but requires certification from a recognized agency like ABC or BOC.
