Licensure Update:

Durable Medical Equipment Supplier License is no longer required for the following:

DM12 External Infusion Pumps and/or supplies

DM13 Insulin Infusion Pumps and/or supplies

DM14 Implanted Infusion Pumps and/or supplies

PE06 Parenteral Equipment and Supplies

R04 Intermittent Positive Pressure Breathing (IPPB Devices)

R05 Intrapulmonary Percussive Ventilation Devices

DM24 External Infusion Pump Supplies

DM25 Insulin Infusion Pump Supplies

State Note Update – Note C

For oxygen a Medical Device Registration Certificate beginning with the number 1 or 3 is required. If they are trans filling oxygen, a certificate beginning with the number 1 is required. A nonprofit entity certificate will begin with the number 70 and is good for both devices and oxygen. Out of state entities that employ sales reps (see note B) will have a registration beginning with the number 72 and is good for devices and oxygen. A certificate beginning with the number 4 or 6 is sufficient for devices but NOT for oxygen. Exemptions: Healthcare facilities (i.e. hospitals, nursing homes), physicians or other prescribing practitioners (CRNP, Physician Assistants, Dentists, Optometrists, Veterinarians, etc.) and Pennsylvania Licensed Pharmacies (nonresident pharmacies must be licensed with the Pennsylvania Board of Pharmacy), acting within their scope of practice or license.

State Note Update – Note C

Medical Equipment Supplier: This permit gives the permit holder the authority to dispense, directly to the patient or ultimate user pursuant to an order of a prescriber, only the following prescription (Rx-only) items: medical oxygen, hypodermic needles and syringes, Schedule VI medical devices, Schedule VI sterile water or saline used in the operation and cleaning of medical devices peritoneal dialysis solutions. Suppliers located outside of Virginia must hold a Non-Resident Medical Equipment Supplier permit. The permit is not needed if the supplier only provides non-prescription (over-the-counter) devices.
